"All things" were Created "through Him" (Col. 1:16 & Jn. 1:3,10)

δι' $\alpha \dot{\upsilon}$ τοῦ (through Him) δι $\dot{\alpha}$ + genitive personal pronoun δι' οὖ (through Whom) δι $\dot{\alpha}$ + genitive relative pronoun

Both terms <u>with a genitive case object</u> ALWAYS require the agent's personal participation. The preposition διὰ can only mean "on account of" <u>if its object is in the accusative case</u> $(\alpha \dot{v} \tau \dot{o} \underline{v})$

John 1:3 All things were made through him, and without him was not anything made

John 1:7 He came as a witness, to bear witness about the light, that all might believe **through** him.

John 1:10 He was in the world, and the world was made through him, yet the world did not know him.

John 3:17 For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved **through him**.

Acts 2:22 "Men of Israel, hear these words: Jesus of Nazareth, a man attested to you by God with mighty works and wonders and signs that God did **through him** in your midst, as you yourselves know –

Romans 5:1 Therefore having been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, 2 **through whom** also we have obtained our introduction by faith into this grace in which we stand; and we exult in hope of the glory of God. ... 9 Much more then, having now been justified by His blood, we shall be saved from the wrath of God **through him**. ... 11 And not only this, but we also exult in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, **through whom** we have now received the reconciliation.

1 Corinthians 8:6 yet to us is one God, the Father, of whom are the all things, and we to Him; and one Lord, Jesus Christ, through whom are the all things, and we through Him;

Ephesians 2:18 For through him we both have access in one Spirit to the Father.

Colossians 1:16 For by him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities-- all things were created **through him** and for him. ...20 and **through him** to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, making peace by the blood of his cross.

Hebrews 1:2 but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed the heir of all things, through whom also he created the world [lit. ages].

Hebrews 7:25 Consequently, he is able to save to the uttermost those who draw near to God **through him**, since he always lives to make intercession for them.

1 John 4:9 In this the love of God was made manifest among us, that God sent his only Son into the world, so that we might live **through him**.

FAIL #1. "Through Him/Whom" actually means "because of Him/Whom." This is proven false from the grammar.

FAIL #2. Jesus was an INCARNATION (becoming flesh) of a PERSONIFICATION ("Wisdom" and "Word" as literary devices, allegorical characters having no tangible existence).

A. Col. 1:15 uses personal pronouns that refer specifically to the Son (Jesus), saying that "all things" were created "through HIM" – Jesus. A literary device (personification) was not God's Agent through whom He created all things. The personal pronouns <u>require</u> <u>personal presence and agency</u>, as was already shown.

- B. John 1:3,10 use personal pronouns in the same way. The pronoun "Him" in vs. 3 refers back to "Word" in vss. 1-2 (so it is dependent on what is meant by "the Word").
 - 1. But "the Word" is identified as "God" (v. 1), which is ALWAYS a Person, and was "with God," which requires a tangible existence (vss. 1-2).
 - 2. In vs. 10 the personal pronoun "Him" clearly refers to Jesus, since in v. 12 those who believe in His name become sons of God.
- **FAIL #3.** The "creation" referenced is the "NEW creation" which began with Jesus' death.
 - A. Colossians 1:16-20
 - 1. <u>"ALL THINGS"</u> in heaven and earth, visible and invisible, "<u>WERE CREATED</u>" (aorist indicative historical event) and "<u>HAVE BEEN CREATED</u>" (perfect participle completed with current results) through Him. The new creation is barely begun, with much to be completed.
 - 2. The same "ALL THINGS" created "through Him" are to be reconciled to God "through Him." What is already "new" cannot be "reconciled" (Col. 1:16 & 20).
 - B. John 1:3,10
 - 1. v. 3 <u>ALL THINGS</u> through Him <u>ORIGINATED</u> (aorist indicative historical event)
 - 2. v. 10 <u>THE ARRANGEMENT</u> through Him <u>ORIGINATED</u> (aorist indicative historical event)
 - a. ὁ κόσμος (lit. "the arrangement") is a reference to the whole completed system of creation as stated in Gen. 2:1 LXX "And was completed the heaven and the earth, even all <u>THE ARRANGEMENT</u> [ὁ κόσμος] of them.
 - b. This \acute{o} κόσμος (arrangement) which originated *through Him* "did NOT KNOW Him." If the redeemed are part of the alleged "new creation," then why did the redeemed not know Him? This can ONLY refer to the original creation.
