Bereans Bible Institute Module V. The Redemption of Creation Lesson 15 – The Davidic Covenant

2 Samuel 2:1-4 David acknowledged as king by tribe of Judah (David's tribe)
A. 2 Samuel 2:5 – 5:1 Civil war between those loyal to Saul and those loyal to David

B. 2 Samuel 5:1-5 Civil war ends, David accepted as king of all 12 tribes.

1. David was the same age as Jesus when He began ministry

2. Joshua's job - drive out seven nations

A. **Deut. 7:1-2**; **Joshua 3:9-10** Joshua was to drive out 7 nations: Canaanites, Hittites, Hivites, Perizzites, Girgashites, Amorites, Jebusites.

B. Joshua 15:63 Joshua drove out 6 of the 7 nations (Jebusites controlled Jerusalem)

3. **2 Samuel 5:6-12** David completed Joshua's job – driving out the Jebusites and taking Jerusalem.

4. 2 Samuel 6 David brings the ark to Jerusalem

5. The Davidic Covenant

A. 1 Chronicles 17

- 1. vs. 9 Israel settled permanently, never to be oppressed again
- 2. vs. 11 David's descendant will be established as king
- 3. vs. 12 He will built God's Temple
- 4. vs. 12 God will establish him as king forever

5. **vs. 12b-14** God will be His father, and He will be the "Son of God." He will be established in God's Temple and Kingdom and reign forever.

B. Psalm 89:1-3,28-37

1. **vss. 1-3** David's "seed" and "throne" established forever to "all generations."

2. **vss. 28-37** God will never cancel His covenant with David, even IF his sons rebel against God, as long as the sun and moon endure.

C. Psalm 132:11-18

1. vs. 11 God will fulfill His promise through the "fruit of David's womb."

2. vs. 13-18 Messiah will reign in Zion.

6. God's covenant with David appears to fail, but will be realized through Jesus Christ
