Lesson 17 – The First Exile (70 Years)

I. The Divided Kingdom

- A. 1 Kings 11:26-42 God gives the northern tribes to Jeroboam, Solomon's servant
- B. 1 Kings 12:1-24 Kingdom split between Rehoboam & Jeroboam
 - 1. The northern Kingdom of Israel
 - a. 1 Kings 12:25-33 Jeroboam inaugurates pagan worship
 - b. ALL of the following kings of "Israel" (Ephraem) were pagan.
 - c. God sent the Assyrians to defeat the northern kingdom
- C. 1 & 2 Kings follows the parallel kingdoms
- D. 2 Chronicles follows the southern kingdom of Judah Solomon's dynasty
 - 1. 20 kings: (Italics = good kings) Reheboam, *Abijam, Asa, Jehoshaphat,* Jehoram, Ahaziah, Athaliah(queen), *Joash, Amaziah, Uzziah, Jotham,* Ahaz, *Hezekiah,* Manasseh, Amon, *Josiah,* Jehoahaz, Jehoiakim, Jehoiachin, Zedekiah
- II. God's threat of Exile from the land in the Law of Moses: Leviticus 25-26
 - A. The length of the FIRST exile (70 years prophesied by Jeremiah 25)
 - B. The length of the SECOND exile would be a multiple of the first exile
 - 1.70x7=490 yrs + 70x7=490 yrs + 70x7=490 yrs + 70x7=490 total = 1960 yrs
 - 2. The second exile began in AD 70 and will end in AD 2029
 - 3. This will be followed by a time of repentance (Daniel's 70th week)
 - 4. Isaiah 46:10 God declared the END from the beginning.
 - C. 2 Chronicles 7 God threatens to destroy Solomon's Temple and send Israel into exile, but also provides a path for repentance and restoration to the Land.
- III. Nebuchadnezzar besieges Jerusalem twice
 - A. The parable of the "Good figs and bad figs" (Jer. 24)
 - 1. Nebuchadnezzar besieges Jerusalem, takes captive Jehoiachin, Ezekiel, Daniel, etc. the "good figs" sent to Babylon to be preserved.
 - a. Ezekiel's prophecy of the 390 years & 40 years (Ezek. 4)
 - 2. Nebuchadnezzar besieges Jerusalem again, and destroys city and Temple 11 years later beginning of the 70 years of desolation and exile
 - 3. 2 Chron. 36:15-21 A summary of why God sent Judah into exile
