Module VI - The Life of Christ

Lesson 5 – The Early Judean Ministry (14 months)

- I. The Length of Jesus' Ministry 3.5 years
 - A. Baptized when He was "beginning" his 30th year (Luke 3:23)
 - B. Baptized around Rosh Hashanah (because that was His birthday)
 - C. Length of ministry determined by a harmony of the Gospels, particularly John
 - 1. Number of Passovers that Jesus attended at Jerusalem
 - a. Mathew, Mark, and Luke only record His last Passover
 - b. John records Jesus attending several feasts:
 - 1. 1st Passover (John 2:23)
 - 2. 2nd Passover (John 5:1)
 - a. "After these things was <u>THE*</u> Feast of the Jews ..." (the primary feast)
 * definite article in majority of mss.
 - b. In Samaria 4 months before barley harvest (planted in November), after fall feasts (John 4:35)
 - 3. 3rd Passover (John 6:4)
 - 4. Tabernacles (John 7:2)
 - 5. Hanukkah (John 10:22)
 - 6. 4th Passover (John 11:55)
- II. John & Jesus Parallel ministries in Judea
 - A. John immediately pointed out the "Lamb of God" (John 1:29-36)
 - B. Jesus calls His first 4 disciples in Judea: Andrew, Peter, Philip, Nathaniel (John 1:37-51)
 - 1. vs. 42, Simon's name changed to "Cephas" Aramaic for "stone," (Greek "Petros" {Peter)).
 - 2. vss. 44-51, Nathaniel a true "Israelite," (Gen. 28:10-22)
 - C. Jesus attends the wedding in Cana of Galilee with His mother, first miracle? (John 2:1-12)
 - 1. First disciples were apparently called to witness Jesus' first public miracle.
 - D. Jesus cleanses the Temple in Judea (John 2:13-22)
 - E. Jesus keeps the Passover (John 2:23-25) AD 27 (6 month mark after baptism)
 - F. Jesus approached by Nicodemus (John 3:1-15)
 - G. John continues to baptize (John 3:22-36)
- III. John cast into prison by Herod (Mark 6:17-18)
 - A. Jesus departs to begin Galilean ministry in Nov., 14 months after baptism (Matt. 4:12; Luke 4:14)
 - B. The stop in Samaria (John 4:1-4)
