Module VI – The Life of Christ Lesson 6 – Detour through Samaria (Part 1)

- I. Jesus departed from Judea for Galilee (Did Jesus do miracles in Judea? Jn. 2:23; 3:1-2; 4:45)
 - A. When John was imprisoned (Matt. 4:12), after hearing that the Pharisees knew that He baptized more people than John (John 4:1-3).
 - B. "He needed to go through Samaria." (John 4:4) imperfect active indicative verb lit. "He <u>was determined</u> to go through Samaria."
 - 1. animosity between the Jews and Samaritans (racism & religious tensions)
 - a. "Good Samaritan" illustrates this barrier (Luke 10:25-37)
 - 2. Jews avoided Samaria, travelling on the eastern side of Jordan to keep the festivals in Jerusalem
 - 3. The Samaritans were hostile to Jews passing through Samaria to keep the feasts (Luke 9:51-56)
 - C. A stop at a famous landmark Jacob's Well (John 4:5-6)
 - 1. 6th hour (v. 6) Roman time counts hours from midnight & noon (6:00pm) (cf. Jn. 19:14), Jewish time counts hours from sunset and sunrise (cf. Luke 23:44).
 - 2. The conversation between Jesus and the Samaritan woman (vss. 7-26)
 - a. Vss. 7-15 The "gift of God" immortality via resurrection (Rom. 6:23)
 - 1. What is "living water?"
 - 1. "Living water" from the Throne of God waters the Tree of Life (Gen. 2:8-10; Ezek. 47:1-12; Rev. 2:7; Rev. 22:1-5; Rev. 22:14,17)
 - 2. The Spirit is the deposit on immortality (Jn. 7:37-39; Rom. 8:11; Eph. 1:13-14)
