Bereans Bible Institute Module XI – Revelation Lesson 12 – Rev. 3:7-13

I. Jesus' Letter to the Assembly at Philadelphia (Rev. 3:7-13)

A. Vs. 7 Jesus' introduction:

1. The 'holy' and 'true' one –

- 2. The one with the 'key of David'
 - a. Full authority: Matt. 11:27; Matt. 28:18; John 3:35; John 13:3

b. The 'Key of David': (Rev. 1:18, Isaiah 22:22 {cf. 2 Kings 18-19)

1. King Hezekiah & Judah besieged by king of Assyria.

2. Instead of turning to God for protection, he stripped all the gold and silver from the Temple and gave it to the Assyrians.

- 3. Assyrians sent letter to Hezekiah demanding surrender.
- 4. Eliakim & Shebna sent to Isaiah
- 5. Eliakim's good advice to Hezekiah
- 6. 'Key of David' given to Eliakim

c. Christ's full authority under God compared to Eliakim's full authority under king Hezekiah.

- B. Vs. 8 Christ observing this assembly with one of His 7 eyes
 - 1. Open door set before them
 - 2. A little strength, attended to Jesus' commandments (SoM)
 - 3. Not denied His name
- C. Vs. 9 Faithful Christians will be vindicated before the imposters
 - 1. Jewish mystics who persecuted Christians (Rev. 2:9)
- D. Vs. 10 defines the 'open door' of verse 8
 - 1. They had 'guarded' Jesus' commandments (Matt. 5:19 & Matt. 7:24-27)
 - 2. He will 'guard' them OUT FROM WITHIN the hour of trial (John 17:15)
 - a. Implies SURVIVAL (Rev. 7:9,13-17)
 - b. 'Guarding' by God in the tribulation (Rev. 12:6,14-17)
 - c. The 'hour of trial' (Matt. 24:21)

d. The whole world" (π $\tilde{\alpha}\sigma\alpha\nu$ τὴν οἰκουμένην / ὅλην τὴν οἰκουμένην / τῆς οἰκουμένης ὅλης) does not necessarily refer to all nations (Luke 2:1; Acts 11:28), although usually it does (Rev. 12:9; Rev. 16:14).

- E. Vs. 11 Possible to lose your 'wreath' of immortality (Rev. 2:10)
- F. Vs. 12 'Column' in the Temple a permanent fixture (Rev. 20:4-6 {Ezek. 40-48})
 - 1. Three names: God's name, New Jerusalem, Jesus' new name.
- G. Vs. 13 The 'Breath' speaks the words of Jesus to the assembly.
