Module XI – Revelation

Lesson 37 - Revelation 15:1-4

I. Rev. 15:1-4 Prelude to the 7 Bowls of Wrath

- A. Verse 1 expands upon Rev. 14:9-11
 - 1. Rev. 14:9 upon those who worship the Beast; (compare Rev. 16:2)
 - 2. Rev. 14:10a they will "drink of the wine of the wrath of God which is mixed undiluted in the cup of His wrath" is indicated by "in them the wrath of God was finished."
 - 3. Rev. 14:10b-11 they are "tormented with fire and sulfur" (fulfilled in the 1st, 4th & 5th bowls)
 - a. in view of the Lamb and the angels
 - b. <u>THIS</u> torment (in the flesh, while still alive) has a later reminder for others SMOKE that ascends "unto ages of ages."
 - a. Described in Isa. 66:22-24, quoted by Jesus in Mark 9:44-48
- B. Verses 2-4 expand upon Rev. 14:12
 - 1. vs. 2 describes "the endurance of the holy ones, the ones keeping the commands of God and the faith of Jesus." (Rev. 14:12)
 - a. The overcomers "are conquering" (present tense) the beast, and thus must be alive on earth while worshippers of Antichrist are tormented by the bowls of wrath.
 - b. they are standing on a "sea as glass having been mixed with fire."
 - 1. the "sea as glass" was previously mentioned in Rev. 4:5-6
 - a. it is in view of the throne along with the 7 Breaths which were the presence of Jesus in the 7 assemblies. Implies that the "assemblies" are the "sea as glass."
 - 2. the "as glass" refers to a perfectly calm sea in the disciples' experience in Matt. 8:23-27. (Jesus has authority over nature)
 - 3. that the overcomers are "standing on the sea" refers to the incident in Matt. 14:23-33. (We overcome by trust in Jesus).
 - 4. the calm sea "mingled with fire" illustrates the surrounding judgment on the worshippers of the Antichrist. This is perfect calm for the faithful assemblies in the midst of the storm of God's wrath.

2. vs. 3-4

- a. The "Song of Moses" (Deut. 32:1-43) was taught to Israel by Moses
- b. It is also "the Song of the Lamb" because Christ is the "Rock who begat you" (v. 18), appearing all throughout this song: (vss. 4,15,18,30-31), and Paul says "that 'Rock' was Christ" (1 Cor. 10:4).
- c. The Son of Moses proclaims God's mighty works, His deliverance of Israel from Egypt (v. 1-13)
- d. It then proclaims Israel's subsequent repeated rebellion, and God's hiding from them in exile while the Gospel goes out to the Gentiles (v. 15-21)
- e. It then proclaims God's wrath upon Israel in exile (v. 22-39)
- f. It describes God's UNDILUTED wrath on Israel in the last 42 months (v. 40-42).
- g. It ends with REJOICING, the gentile believers along with the remnant of Israel (144,000), after destroying all His adversaries, and then purging the Land for His people (v. 43 LXX).
